Thank you for your interest in New Hope Equine Assisted Therapy. We are a non-profit organization 501 (C) (3), which provides Equine Assisted Activities and Equine Assisted Learning classes to children and adults with physical, cognitive, and emotional disabilities and challenges.

New Hope is a Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship (PATH) International Member Center. We maintain the standards of safety, education and animal welfare set forth by this association.

New Hope considers the following guidelines when accepting equestrians:

Medical History & Medical Professional Statement: . This form must be completed by a licensed medical
professional to include a diagnosis as it relates to Equine Assisted Activities and be signed and dated by
a licensed medical professional. Applications can be mailed, emailed, or dropped off at our facility. See our
contact information below.

Weight Guidelines For Mounted Activities:

Under 5' tall 150 lbs. or less
 5'1" --- 5'6" 175 lbs. or less
 5'7" --- 6' 200 lbs. or less
 6'1" --- 6'5" 250 lbs. or less

Evaluation Entry Interview: All forms must be completed, signed and returned to our office prior to the evaluation interview. New Hope's Program Manager will conduct the evaluation, where prospective equestrian must be present. The goal of the evaluation is to conclude that participation in the program will have a positive impact on the prospective equestrian. It may be necessary for the interviewer to consult with the applicant's physician and/or support team in order to compile all needed information, which will require a release of information form.

Class Schedule: Equestrians are assigned to lessons based on age, capabilities, availability of an appropriate horse, and the number of volunteers needed for a safe experience. Lessons are once a week and are approximately an hour in length. Class size is limited to five equestrians. Once approved through the evaluation process, the qualified equestrian will be assigned to an appropriate lesson or placed on a waiting list.

Cost: Tuition is \$60 per lesson. Lessons are not covered by health insurance, however financial assistance is available for families who qualify.

New Hope makes every effort to provide enough volunteers to serve our equestrians. Unfortunately, there are times when, despite our best efforts, we have a shortage of trained volunteers. In those instances lessons may have to be cancelled.

Participant Contract

Please Keep for Your Records

The following are requirements that must be read and adhered to while participating in the lessons offered at New Hope.

PAYMENT FOR LESSONS:

- 1. Tuition is \$60 per class, and typically one class per week. Session starts in September and goes through the end of June with applicable days off for holidays and weather. Tuition is payable to New Hope by cash, check, or PayPal. Please stay current on payments.
- 2. Unless a prior agreement is in place, lessons will <u>discontinue</u> after 3 non-payment of lessons. If you are currently behind, please contact Dave Kershen at 214-417-9645, or <u>dkershen@newhopeequine.com</u> to make a payment or set up a payment plan prior to resuming lessons.
- 3. If the equestrian's tuition is being funded by a third-party payer, New Hope will invoice the third-party payer. However, the equestrian or parents/guardians of the equestrian are ultimately responsible for payment.
 - * Please note that all outstanding accounts need to be paid in full prior to starting each September.

ATTENDANCE:

If an equestrian is unable to attend their scheduled lesson, a 24 hour advance notice is required. This absence would be considered excused.

If an equestrian gives less than 24 hours but greater than 2 hours, a \$20 charge will be assessed to the equestrian's account, and this absence would be considered <u>unexcused</u>.

If the equestrian is a "no show" (less than 45 minutes notice), he or she will be charged the <u>entire cost</u> for that lesson. If the equestrian's tuition is being funded by a third-party payer, the third party payer will not pay for classes and the <u>equestrian</u> will be responsible for payment.

- a. Equestrians with 3 (three) unexcused absences may be removed from the program with the loss of payment received for classes.
- b. Emergency situations are the only exception for not calling to cancel. In the case of a true emergency a fee will not be charged.

In the event an equestrian no longer wants to participate in the program, a one-week notice would be greatly appreciated. This allows New Hope to schedule staff, volunteers and horses accordingly.

You will be asked to date and sign to acknowledge you have read and understand the payment and attendance policy.



PRECAUTIONS & CONTRAINDICATIONS

Please Keep for Your Records

In order to safely provide this service, New Hope Equine Assisted Therapy requires that a licensed medical professional complete the Medical History/Physician's Statement Form which is step three of the rider registration process.

The following conditions, if present, *may* represent precautions, which require additional investigation or modifications to make riding safe, or contraindications, which make the activity inappropriate from a safety consideration.

EQUESTRIAN GUIDELINES

PLEASE KEEP FOR YOUR RECORDS

Equine Assisted Activities/ Equine Assisted Learning Classes: All classes are conducted by a certified PATH, Intl. Instructor or Instructor in Training candidate (ITC). All instructors and staff are certified in CPR/First Aid for both children and adults the The instructor will work with each equestrian and their support team to develop goals and objectives. These classes include exercises to increase core strength and motor control, lessons on horsemanship skills and horse care, and focus on helping equestrians better manage challenges in their daily lives.

Most lessons are approximately 1 hour in length, including tack & untack time. In some cases, lesson time may be shortened to accommodate the special needs of an equestrian or modified due to weather.

Calendar Year: Equine Assisted Activities and Equine Assisted Learning classes will be scheduled September through June. Please check emails for scheduled holidays and special events when New Hope will be closed (Thanksgiving, Christmas, Memorial Day). Our facility is open during July and August for summer camp, private workshops, clinics and program management.

Annual Update of Records: All equestrians must re-submit application forms, including Authorization for Emergency Medical Treatment, Physician's Statement/Medical History, and Liability Release annually.

Tuition: Tuition is \$60 per lesson, based on one lesson per week. Tuition is payable to New Hope by cash, check, or credit card (through PayPal). Credit payments require the fees be covered by participant. Financial aid is available to qualified families by request provided we have the funds available. Attendance: If you must miss your scheduled class fill out the "report an absence" form at https://www.newhopeequine.com/report-rider-absence at least 72 hours in advance. Preferred method.

If it is within 24 hours of lesson time, text your instructor.

In an emergency, or less than 24 hours prior to lesson, phone (817) 729-5315 as soon as possible.

Volunteers who give their time each week to assure the safety of your rider are expecting you to be present. Some volunteers drive an hour to come help your rider be safe. When a scheduled rider does not show up or give enough notice, the volunteers who work with your rider may become discouraged and may drop out. This jeopardizes the entire program.

Attendance: Instructors will keep attendance records for all equestrians. Absences that the equestrian has given 24 hours notice for will be considered "excused." All other absences will be considered "unexcused."

*EQUESTRIANS WITH 3 UNEXCUSED ABSENCES MAY LOSE THEIR SPOT IN CLASS AND BE PLACED ON THE WAITING LIST.*If you give 24 hours notice, you will be given a credit for the missed class. If you do not give 24 hours notice, NO CREDIT or REFUND will be given.

Late Policy: It is extremely important for the equestrian to <u>arrive 10 minutes prior</u> to class. If the equestrian is late for their scheduled lesson, New Hope cannot guarantee he/she will be able to ride. Once the lesson has begun, the instructor will not be able to leave the other equestrians to accommodate late arrivals.

Appropriate Clothing: All equestrians must wear ASTM/SEI-approved helmets when mounted. New Hope provides these helmets. Riders must wear <u>long pants</u>. All footwear must have <u>closed toes</u>. Hard-soled, sturdy shoes with heels are encouraged.

Weather Conditions: Preexisting: Classes will be canceled prior to scheduled time. All efforts will be made to contact families prior to that time. **Unplanned:** Should electrical storms, or tornado warnings occur during riding time, lessons will be delayed until safe conditions are established.



Safety Rules

PLEASE KEEP FOR YOUR RECORDS

All equestrians, family members, volunteers, staff and guests must comply with all posted safety rules. New Hope staff requests that all volunteers help to enforce these safety rules.

Safety is our Top Priority!



NO SMOKING OR VAPING. Smoking is not allowed anywhere on New Hope property.



NO WEAPONS including concealed firearms are allowed on the premises.



Observe and obey all posted safety and restricted area signs.



All persons within horse area will wear closed toed shoes. Riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets and appropriate foot wear.



No family pets allowed.



Family and guests are requested to sit quietly in the parent area.

Please refrain from leaning or climbing on all arena fences.



All treats must be approved by the instructor before being given to horses using the treat bucket. NEVER HAND FEED TREATS TO THE HORSES.



The mistreatment, abuse, or verbal suggestions of abuse of any person or of any animal will not be tolerated.



Please remember to keep our facility clean by disposing of trash properly.



No cell phones or pagers inside the arena.



Parents are responsible for the supervision of their children AT ALL TIMES. Absolutely no running, yelling, or disruptive behavior will be tolerated.



All volunteers/riders on property must have an adult staff member present at all times.



Infectious Disease Guidelines

PLEASE KEEP FOR YOUR RECORDS

For Anyone Coming on to New Hope Property

- Do Not come to New Hope if:
 - You or anyone in your household is running a fever or displaying symptoms of any illness
 - You or anyone in your household have been diagnosed with Covid-19, Flu, or any other contagious infection, including lice etc.
 - You or anyone in your household have been exposed to anyone with suspected or confirmed Covid-19
 - You or anyone in your household is at high risk for Covid-19 (see CDC guidelines)
 - · You are uncomfortable in any way about coming onto New Hope property

When on New Hope Property

- 1. All volunteers/riders on property must have an adult staff member present at all times.
- 2. No volunteer/rider comes on property after running a fever, until they have been symptom free for CDC recommended guidelines for the illness in question
- 3. Everyone coming on property is required to wash hands for 20 seconds with antibacterial soap and water before signing in, and before leaving premises. More frequent hand washing encouraged
- 4. Instructors required to wash hands using 20-30 second protocol before and after coming into contact with high traffic surfaces
- 5. Sanitizer is available
- 6. Maintain the social distancing rule of 6 feet
- 7. Masks may be worn but are not required



Waiver and Release of Liability & Indemnity Agreements

When submitting your **online** application, the undersigned will be asked to acknowledge that he/she has read this Indemnity & Release form in its entirety, that he/she understands the terms of this release, and signs this release voluntarily and with full knowledge of the effects thereof.

All equine activities at or with New Hope Equine Assisted Therapy involve inherent risks and dangers, which could result in personal injury or death. I/we acknowledge the risks and dangers of a horse-back riding program to myself, my minor child, my ward, or any person(s) I bring on-site to a New Hope Equine Assisted Therapy location or event, however believe that the possible benefits to myself, my child, my ward, are greater than the risks and dangers assumed.

UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), AN EQUINE PROFESSIONAL IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN EQUINE ACTIVITES RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISK OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

I HEREBY, INTENDING TO BE LEGALLY BOUND FOR MYSELF, MY HEIRS AND ASSIGNS, EXECUTORS OR ADMINISTRATORS, EXPRESSLY WAIVE AND RELEASE FOREVER ALL CLAIMS FOR DAMAGES, COMPENSATION, OR LIABILITY ARISING AGAINST NEW HOPE EQUINE ASSISTED THERAPY, ITS BOARD OF TRUSTEES, INSTRUCTORS, THERAPISTS, AIDS, VOLUNTEERS, AND/OR EMPLOYEES FOR ANY OR ALL PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH THAT I, MY MINOR CHILD, OR MY WARD MAY SUSTAIN IN CONNECTION WITH THE NEW HOPE EQUINE ASSISTED THERAPY ACTIVITY, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER SUCH PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH IS CAUSED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY THE NEGLIGENCE OR FAULT OF NEW HOPE EQUINE ASSISTED THERAPY, ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS, GUARANTORS, INSTRUCTORS, THERAPISTS, AIDES, EMPLOYEES AND VOLUNTEERS ("RELEASEES").
